The Associate of Science in Engineering (AS Engineering) degree is intended for students planning to transfer to a four-year institution to pursue a Bachelor of Science degree in engineering. The AS Engineering degree differs from the Associate of Arts (AA) degree in the level of mathematics and science coursework that is required. It is crucial that students begin the math sequence in the first semester of study in order to complete the degree in two years. Students entering MACC ready to enroll in MTH 201 their first semester can expect to complete the AS degree in four semesters. Students not meeting the entrance requirements for MTH 201 are encouraged to enroll in MTH 150 in the first semester of study. MTH 150 is specifically designed to provide AS Engineering students with the preparation needed to successfully complete the Calculus series. Students requiring additional math preparation prior to Precalculus will require additional semesters to complete the degree.

A grade of “C” or better is required for MTH 201, MTH 202, and PHY 201 to graduate. A grade of “C” or better is recommended for all courses to ensure transfer of credit. All AS students are encouraged to work with an advisor from both MACC and the planned transfer institution to create an individualized plan of study tailored to meet individual needs.

Additional Graduation Requirement – Missouri law, included in Senate Bill 807, requires every college student pursuing an associate’s or bachelor’s degree at a public institution to pass the Missouri Higher Education Civics Achievement Examination with at least a 70 percent to graduate. The rule will apply to the incoming class of first-time college students in the fall of 2019 and all students thereafter.
