MACC History

- Founded as Moberly Junior College in 1927 as part of Moberly public school district. Separated from high school in 1968
- Renamed Moberly Area Community College in 1990
- Expanded to other locations in late 1990s

Accreditation

MACC is accredited through the Higher Learning Commission - HLC.

All two-year degree and certificate programs are approved by the Missouri Coordinating Board for Higher Education. Specific programs within the College are approved by the Missouri Department of Elementary and Secondary Education.

Articulation Agreements & Partnerships with Area Institutions

MACC has numerous articulation agreements with four-year institutions to facilitate smooth transfer. 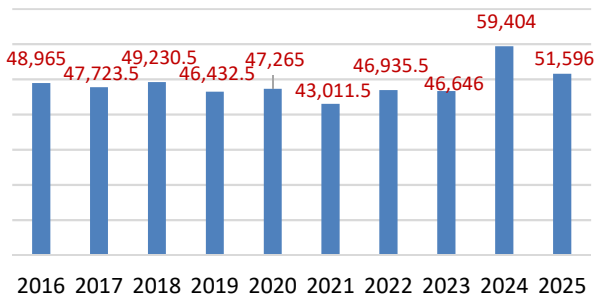

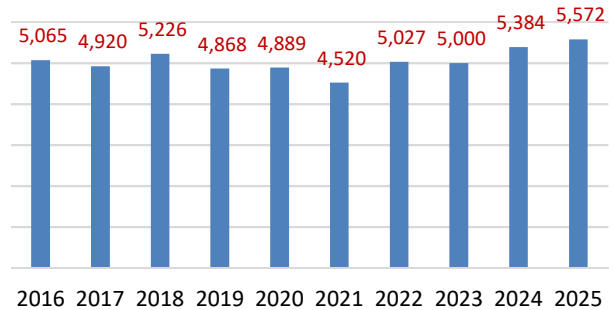

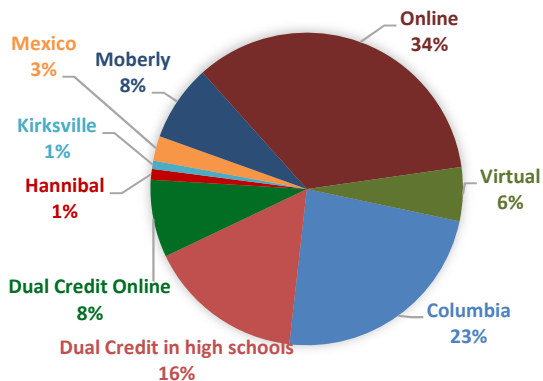
Credit Hours (Fall Semester - Census)
